Introduction

1. Take time as a group to share “daily bread” gifts. Share simple provisions that we often forget to be thankful for, but that the Lord has provided for you.

Core Questions

2. In verse 1-3, the Israelites have a legitimate need, but they faithlessly grumbled against God. What is the difference between grumbling to God and going to him faithfully with your requests and needs?
3. In verse 4, we see that the Lord allowed the Israelites to gather only what they needed for one day. How does the Lord love us through and out of our “scarcity (or orphan) mindset”?

Inward Grace in Action

4. How does God’s provision of manna in Exodus 16:4 foreshadow Jesus as the ‘true bread from heaven’ (John 6:31-35), and what does this teach us about how Christ is our true need?

Outward Grace in Action

5. Just like the Israelites we and the world around us can become constant grumblers and complainers, where in your week can you avoid grumbling and thus seek show Christ to those around you?
